

## Scott Morrill Bio

Scott is Project Manager in the Criminal Investigations Division at the Utah Attorney General's office. His responsibilities include managing complex projects, skilled professionals, and controlling of project activities to meet project objectives. He is manager over the Utah Attorney General's nationally recognized Identity Theft Reporting Information System (IRIS). IRIS is the nation's first and only online statewide identity theft reporting system, where citizens' reports of identity theft are automatically delivered to law enforcement for investigation. In addition to serving as IRIS project lead, Scott is project manager for CrimeReports.com and the Cold Case web site projects. Each provides Utah citizens an online resource to submit reports and tips of crime, and to view reported crimes in their communities. Scott also provides assistance to Utah victims of identity theft, and presents at conferences on identity theft and IRIS.

Scott has over 20 years of experience working in the information technology industry. Before joining the Criminal Investigations Division, Scott was IT Manager for the Utah Attorney General's office where he coordinated office-wide information technologies, staff, and systems. He worked in the private sector as a Field Engineer for 10 years prior to joining the Attorney General's office. Scott holds a MBA from the University of Utah, a B.S. in Finance from Westminster College, and a computer Technologies Certificate from CCI. As part of his graduate education, Scott traveled to Switzerland and Italy to study international business.
